- Control limit Further guidance on O.E.L.'s and the assessment of occupational exposure to harmful materials is given in H.S.E. Guidance note EH40.
- (a) Over exposures are irritating to the eyes and respiratory system.

 Excessive concentrations may produce effects on the central nervous system including drowsiness. In extreme cases loss of consciousness may result.
- (b) Long term exposure to vapour concentrations in excess of O.E.L.'s may result in adverse health effects.
- (c) Splashes entering the eye will cause discomfort and possible damage.
- (d) Prolonged contact with the skin may have a defatting effect which may lead to skin irritation and in some cases dermititis.
- (e) Certain colours, identified on the package label, contain lead based pigments. The Control of Lead at Work Regulations 1980 should be observed. These colours must not be applied to surfaces which may be chewed by children or animals.
- 2 PRECAUTIONS IN HANDLING AND USE Avoid the inhalation of vapours and spray mist by the provision of good natural ventilation sufficient to keep airborne concentrations below the O.E.L. during the application and drying of paint films.

In operations where natural ventilation is insufficient to achieve this e.g. spray painting or work in enclosed areas, exposure should be controled, where reasonably practicable, by the use of mechanical exhaust ventilation; when this is not reasonably practicable suitable respiratory protective equipment must be worn.

Avoid contact with skin and eyes. Wear appropriate protective clothing and eye protection to BS 2092. Barrier creams may help to protect exposed areas of skin, but are not a substitute for full physical protection.
